for extraordinary accomplishment*

An Invitation to Nominate

The Stockholm Water Prize is the world's most prestigious prize for outstanding achievements in water-related activities. It honours individuals, institutions or organisations whose work contributes broadly to the conservation and protection of water resources and to improved health of the planet's inhabitants and ecosystems. Indeed, any water related activity is eligible because the award's purpose is to recognise the most extraordinary body of accomplishments with great potential or proven impact.

H.M. King Carl XVI Gustaf of Sweden is the Patron of the prize, which includes a 150,000 USD cash award and a crystal sculpture specially designed and created by Orrefors.

Founded by the Stockholm Water Foundation, the prize is additionally supported by the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, International Water Association, Water Environment Federation and the City of Stockholm. The Stockholm International Water Institute administers the nomination process and the award program.

A nine-member international Nominating Committee appointed by the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences reviews nominations from around the world and recommends a Prize Laureate to the Board of the Stockholm Water Foundation, which makes the final decision. In March, the Prize Laureate is announced in connection with the United Nations World Water Day. The prize is presented to the Laureate at a Royal Ceremony and Banquet in the Stockholm City Hall during the World Water Week in Stockholm in August.

Over the years, the Stockholm Water Prize Laureates have represented regions from all over the world and a broad range of water-related activities, professions and scientific disciplines. The competition is intense, and standards are the highest in the field. To gain the Stockholm Water Prize, the winner's accomplishment must stand in a class of its own.

Help Find the 2010 Stockholm Water Prize Laureate

The Stockholm International Water Institute actively encourages members from academia, science, government, civic organisations, NGOs and similar sectors to nominate an individual or an organisation whose work merits singular recognition.

Please note that self-nominations or nominations made by persons closely related to the Nominee are not accepted.

2010 Stockholm Water Prize Nomination Procedure

Nominations should be submitted in English and reach the Stockholm International Water Institute before September 30, 2009. To submit a nomination, please follow the procedure described below:

- Nominations should include a clear description of the nominee's main achievements, with special emphasis on significance and impact and at least two independent, informative letters of reference.
