Water: A Global Crisis

The world water crisis is both severe and entirely avoidable.

Risk of water wars rises with scarcity Almost half of humanity will face water scarcity by 2030 and strategists from Israel to Central Asia prepare for strife. Water scarcity a contributing cause of wars, terrorism in Middle East, North Africa




Defining "Water Diplomacy"





The difference between water diplomacy and water cooperation: Water as a goal in itself or water as a means for goals beyond water (stability, peace and cooperation)

Water Diplomacy: Opportunities and giz Risks for RBOs

Water diplomacy provides benefits to basins, countries and riparian populations and opportunities to RBOs:

- Strengthening RBO's relevance
- Linking science/analyses to policy decisions
- Ensuring the basis for long-term sustainable basin development

BUT: Water diplomacy engagement also comes with risks for RBOs:

- Politization/securitization
- Risks to impartiality
- Capacity insufficiencies

RBOs need to carefully assess opportunities and benefits before embarking into water diplomacy activities.
